According to a recent report by the International Energy Agency (IEA) Global energy generation output is set to increase by nearly 3.4% in 2018 and by 4.3% in 2019. This implies that energy generation is set to increase by 63.1%. Indeed, according to the IEA, rapid growth of technology and electronics demand for electricity in major economies and the expanding penetration of renewables across the globe have been the main driving force behind global energy growth. However, the IEA also notes that global energy consumption is set to increase by slightly under 1.8% in 2018 and 1.9% in 2019. Nevertheless, in contrast to global energy generation, energy consumption is set to decline by 2.3% in 2018 and by 1.5% in 2019. With global energy generation set to increase by 3.4% in 2018 and 4.3% in 2019, and energy consumption also set to increase by 1.8% in 2018 and by 1.9% in 2019, then the IEA forecasts that global energy use will increase by 3.6% in 2018 and 4.9% in 2019. Indeed, despite the 3.6% and 4.9% increases in energy use in 2018 and 2019 respectively, this means that global energy use has declined by 0.1% in 2018, and by 0.2% in 2019. Therefore, despite the upward trend for global energy use, the IEA notes that global energy demand in 2018 will fall by 1.0% and by 1.1% in 2019. With this being the case
